

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- Before commencing any assembly, read through these instructions in detail to gain a thorough understanding of assembly methods and associated details.
- Unpack the carton and carefully identify and check off all the parts against the parts described and illustrated on "COMPONENTS PACKING LIST" pages.

SITE PREPARATION

- The site for the shed must be level. An uneven surface may result in misalignment of parts.
- The shed shall be erected on top of a reinforced concrete slab and anchored down appropriately illustrated on "FINAL CONSTRUCTION" page.

TOOLS REQUIRED



SAFETY NOTES

- Some parts may have sharp edges. It is advisable to wear gloves when handling these items and safety glasses if drilling holes. Sensible shoes are highly recommended.
- Do not erect your shed in windy conditions.
- Ensure that the shed is securely anchored to a solid foundation immediately after construction is completed.
- It is highly recommended to erect the shed with two or more people.
- Do not sit, stand or walk on the roof of your shed.



SNAPTITE ASSEMBLY GUIDE

The Snaptite Assembly System locks end channels to all roof and wall sheets without the need for tools and fasteners.

To assemble each panel, the perimeter channels are secured to the top and bottom of each panel. Gently tap the channel over the SNAPTiTE lugs on the sheet, working along the sheet.

Each perimeter channel must finish flush with the edges of the sheets. Simply tap the channel along the sheets until each end is neatly flush. If you need to remove channels from the panels, slide it off from the side.





Channel locks the shed panel into position without the need for screws!

FASTENING SYMBOLS




Secure channel to sheeting by SNAPTiTE fastening method.



Join components together with one screw at this location only, as some channels have extra holes that are not required for this model of shed.



Do not join components together at this location yet, as the screws may obstruct further assembly of the other components.






ROOF PANEL ASSEMBLY


LEFT SIDE PANEL

DOOR PANEL ASSEMBLY




Lay the LEFT SIDE PANEL face up and lay the DOOR PANEL down in the open position on top as shown.


Using three rivets per hinge, FAST009, secure the door to the frame.

NOTE: Run the 3mm drill bit through the punched holes in the jamb before riveting the hinge on.








Notch out both bottom corners as shown using tinsnips.



REAR PANEL ASSEMBLY



FITTING MESH PANELS



The mesh panels are fixed to the interior of the wall panels.

There are six holes in the border of the mesh panel, these align with holes in the vertical jambs 70D in the wall panel and are fixed with FAST001 screws.

The top and bottom FAST001 are to be screwed from the inside of the panel.

The middle two are to be done from the exterior.

If the panel is bowing out between screws use additional fixings. Be sure to predrill with a 3mm drill bit before using additional FAST001 screws.

Repeat this for every mesh position.


WARNING: It is recommended that new galvanised mesh should be weathered for two (2) months or scrubbed with a mild acidic solution, such as vinegar, then rinsed with water before being used in bird housing applications.

PANEL CONSTRUCTION

NOTE: Take care to ensure that all wall panels are not upside down. The top channels of each panel are pre-punched for attaching roof sheeting. The base channels are not pre-punched.



ASSEMBLY STEPS

1 - Attach the top loop

For both feeder and drinker

REQUIRES:

RWG19 - Pipe (x1)

FAST007 - Saddle (x1)

FAST002 - Bolt (x2)


FAST005 - Nut (x2)

6mm drill bit

Centre the saddle on the widest face of the pipe, 15mm from one end as shown.

Using the saddle as a template mark both hole positions on the pipe and drill using a 6mm bit.

Fasten with a nut and bolt through each hole.



2 - Attach the end cap

For both feeder and drinker

REQUIRES:

RWG19 - Pipe (x1)

HC01 or HC02 - Feeder or Drinker (x1)


Silicone joint sealer and aplicator

Orientate the endcap so that its loop is on the same side of the pipe as the top loop fitted in the previous step.

A watertight seal is required for the drinker unit. To do this a silicone joint sealer is required to bond the endcap to the pipe body. Select one that is non-toxic and follow the instructions to achieve the best result.

Apply the sealer to the outside of the pipe, no higher than 20mm from the end, press into end cap and let set.

TIP: Have a cloth handy to clean up any silicone that may ooze out.

3 - Fit the cup

For drinker only

REQUIRES:

Drinker unit (x1)

HC03 - Drinker cup (x1)


Make sure that the threaded part of the cup is pointing up. If it isn't unclip the black valve and reorientate so it looks like the figure on the right.

The cup has a self-tapping thread, it is to be screwed into the hole in the bottom of the drinker in the same way you would tighten a screw (turn clockwise).

Align it straight into the hole and turn slowly.

Stop turning when the cup is pointing outward in the forward position.

Be sure to clean up the unit from any debris made by the assembly process before use.




For both feeder and drinker

REQUIRES:

Drinker unit (x2)

Take the remaining end caps and simply put onto the top to stop vermin getting into the feed!

Orientate so the loop is to the front.




INSTALLING

Where to put them

Identify the height from the ground that you wish to mount the unit.

TIP: It is common for chooks to toss their feed onto the ground before eating it, to discourage this wasteful habit mount the feeder at a height that they can reach with their beaks and not their feet.

Position out of the rain to minimise the chances of spoiled feed.



Mounting the hooks

REQUIRES:

FAST078 - Hook (x2)

FAST002 - Bolt (x2)

FAST005 - Nut (x2)

FAST077 - Washer (x2)

6mm drill bit


The units are hung using hooks. Two are supplied and recommended for each unit.


One hook is for the top saddle, mount this one on the wall first at the desired height. The other hook is to be at the height of the bottom loop.

Measure down from saddle-to-loop on the back of feeder and drinker units and make this the distance between hooks on the wall.

The feeder & drinker units can be fitted to the mesh panels or wall of the chicken coop.

The hooks can be fastened through sheet metal by drilling a 6mm diameter hole. No hole is needed when fitting through mesh, It's important to use the washer in this case.

Troubleshooting

Drinker is leaking

Check the seal made between the endcap and the pipe. If this is found to be the source of the leak due to a bad silicone joint it will have to be done again.

A method to separate the endcap and pipe is squeezing in on both wide faces of the pipe, flexing them inward, breaking the seal. Next hold the cap firmly and wiggle the pipe free. Be sure to follow the joint sealer instructions when reapplying.

If the source of the leak is found to be the hole for the cup it may have been overtightened when originally assembled. Try taking it out, applying thread tape and fitting again.

Feeder is blocked

Position the feeder in a spot that means it won't get wet. Use the supplied plug to resist water entry.

The wall of the pipe directly above the feed slide can be carefully cut away to offer less resistance to feed, but be careful as removing too much will make it run out and over the edge of the feeder slide.

Another cause of blockages can be spoiled feed, be sure to clean the pipes regularly as this will stop it from being blocked and also help with the health of your chooks.

There is no water in the orange Drinker cup.

Chooks will naturally peck the yellow coloured valve and this releases water which is gobbled-up straight away.

If you are certain that the chooks have not figured it out you can train them by placing a piece of feed on the valve, when they peck it water will be released.




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
Absco Sheds Storage Guidelines

- Absco Sheds are designed to be weatherproof for normal weather conditions. In the event of extreme weather conditions such as heavy rain, combined with high wind gusts, the ridge capping, sheeting joins, screw fixings etc., may exhibit minor deformations which may allow some water entry. These areas should be checked regularly to ensure that maximum strength and protection is maintained.
- Other weather conditions such as extreme heat and extreme cold, moist or dry air can influence the effects of concrete floor moisture and/or condensation on the underside of the roof sheets.
- Absco Sheds and storage units are primarily used for storage of garden equipment such as lawnmowers, wheelbarrows, garden tools etc. Storage items that might be adversely affected by any of the above conditions may require additional protection such as being sealed or covered by plastic sheets and/or stacked above the concrete floor on timber slats.
- Waterproof sealants may be used to offer further protection where required around joins and screw fixings, as can rubber door seals and other products which are available from most hardware outlets.
- Placement of waterproof sealants (silicone) between the base of the shed and concrete slab is not recommended, as this process can have a reverse effect, preventing excess water from escaping, resulting with water accumulating and being trapped inside the shed.
